The objectives of the Alliance are to:

- Promote the dissemination and use of health policy and systems research knowledge to improve the performance of health systems.

Description of duties:

European Commission's press release on safe, innovative and accessible medicines: a renewed vision for the pharmaceutical sector.

The EU has been losing ground in pharmaceutical innovation. European patients still suffer from inequalities in the availability of information about medicines, whilst counterfeits are on the rise. To address these challenges, the Commission has tabled a package, consisting of four key parts:

- 1. A communication to launch reflections on ways to improve market access and to develop initiatives to boost EU pharmaceutical research.
- 2. A proposal to tackle the growing issues of counterfeiting and illegal distribution of medicines,
- 3. Proposals to enable citizens to have access to high-quality information on prescription-only medicines,

4. Proposals to improve patient protection by strengthening the EU system for the safety monitoring ('pharmacovigilance') of medicines.

In this competition, two experiences will be selected and rewarded. During the Celebration, an award will be given to the winning Best Practice for each of the following categories:

- An organization related to the public sector (Ministry of Health, another Sector–Education, Ministry of Women -, NGO or academic institution that works with the public health sector) that has developed a Best Practice incorporating a gender perspective in health that includes populations of ethnic origin (indigenous population, African descent, migrant, displaced).

4. European NGOs working for public health in Europe

This new section will introduce a different NGO working for public health in Europe every month. This month: the Health & Environment Alliance (HEAL) http://www.env-health.org/.

The Health and Environment Alliance aims to raise awareness of how environmental protection improves health. It achieves this by creating opportunities for better representation of citizens' and health experts' perspectives in the environment and health-related European policy-making. Membership includes a diverse network of 54 citizens', patients', women's, health professionals' and environmental organisations across Europe and has a strong track record in increasing public and expert engagement in both EU debates and the decision-making process. 11 members are international or European organisations and 43 works at national or local in 22 different countries. Aims:

- Make European citizens and NGOs more aware of policy changes that can help or hinder progress towards sustainable development
- Support the participation of citizens in policy making at the European level and represent their concerns
- Strengthen EU policies in favour of better protection of health and the environment
- Link significant research findings to recommendations on policy action

HEAL is pleased to present their latest publication entitled "*Choosing our Future – For A Healthier Life, Consume Chemicals in Moderation*!", published together with Mouvement pour les Droits et le Respect des Générations Futures (MDRGF) and David Ratte are delighted to present you their latest publication

The "Choosing our Future" comic strip highlights – in a humorous and simple way – the recent evidence of harm to health from certain widely used chemicals. The publication and associated website, produced in English and French, aim to provide readers with what is currently known about the links between health and man-made chemicals and examples of individual action and EU policy opportunities that can help produce changes for the better.

The book is divided into the four comic strips and five other sections: an introduction; explanations of certain key words in "Behind the dialogue" section, all of which are scientifically referenced; a "What you can do yourself" section; a chapter on EU chemicals policy, including REACH (Registration, Evaluation, Restriction and Authorisation of Chemicals); and, a glossary.

The four comic strip stories highlight different worrying aspects of exposure to man-made chemicals, such as the special vulnerabilities of the unborn baby and children, how synthetic substances are building up in our bodies, and how exposure to a mixture of chemicals known as the "cocktail effect" may be multiplying the adverse effects of exposure. The final story and texts suggest some alternatives found in an "organic life".

The stories touch on the health conditions associated with environmental risks, such as allergies, asthma, brain development disturbances, certain cancers due to disruption to our hormone system, and fertility problems. The publication explains the facts behind the dialogue, which are scientifically referenced. Other sections cover both what the individual and the EU can do to ensure and healthier and better future.
