ABSTRACTS

We thank all colleagues for submitting their abstracts. We received 1,366 abstracts for individual presentations (oral, pitch, e-posters) and a record number of 107 abstracts for workshops. Abstracts are now being reviewed by the International Scientific Committee (ISC) that consists of 86 eminent (public) health experts from across Europe. We are grateful to our ISC members without whose good work the high scientific quality of the EPH Conference could not be guaranteed. The review results will be announced by mid-June.
