The 12th European Public Health Conference is organised by the EPH Conference Foundation, a non-governmental and not-for-profit organisation, established at the initiative of the European Public Health Association (EUPHA). Co-organisers of the conference are EUPHA and the Société Française de Santé Publique (SFSP).

EPH CONFERENCE FOUNDATION

The mission of the EPH Conference Foundation is to contribute to promoting greater health and well-being for the population in Europe by organising scientific conferences on public health in Europe on an annual basis. The conferences bring together public health professionals, researchers, education and training specialists and policy makers from across Europe and beyond to develop new thinking and find meaningful solutions for future health challenges.

In organising the conference programme, the EPH Conference Foundation works together in partnership with a wide array of international public health organisations. Over the years, the EPH Conferences, which started as EUPHA Conferences more than 25 years ago, have grown into the largest annual public health event in Europe.

EUPHA

EUPHA is an umbrella organisation for national (public) health associations in Europe. EUPHA is an international, multidisciplinary, scientific organisation, bringing together around 20,000 public health experts from all European countries. EUPHA unites 41 national associations of public health and 25 institutional members from 47 countries. EUPHA aims to be a leading scientific and independent voice in the field of public health and health services by building capacity and knowledge in the field of public health and health services and by supporting practice and policy decisions through scientific evidence.

EUPHA is dedicated to working in partnership with European and international intergovernmental and non-governmental organisations as well as with national institutes and organisations that are aligned with EUPHA's values and commitment to improve current and future health in Europe. In 2019, EUPHA has set up partnerships with 14 international organisations.

SOCIÉTÉ FRANÇAISE DE SANTÉ PUBLIQUE (SFSP)

The origins of the French Society of Public Health (SFSP) date back to 1877. In that year, the Society of Public Medicine and Professional Hygiene held its first regular meeting under the presidency of Apollinaire Bouchardat, pharmacist and doctor, in Paris. Since then, the Society was known under several successive names that reflect the evolution of public health as a discipline throughout the twentieth century. It is known as French Society for Public Health (SFSP) since 1992.

Today, the French Society for Public Health brings together about 50 organizations and 500 individuals from all fields of public health. It offers an open space for many disciplines for collective and inter-professional reflection. This reflection is based in particular on the critical analysis of scientific facts and professional practices. It makes it possible to formulate proposals for the decision-makers and, through the media, to enlighten the public opinion on the stakes of the health policies, the strengths and the weaknesses of their implementation.



WELCOME TO MARSEILLE 2019

We are very pleased to welcome you to the 12th European Public Health Conference in Marseille.

The theme of this year's conference is 'Building bridges for solidarity and public health'. Marseille has for centuries been one of the pillars of the cultural and economic bridge across the Mediterranean. For millenniums, people have been crossing the Mediterranean but, in recent years, that journey has been characterized by tragedies among those fleeing oppression and poverty.

The Marseille conference offers an opportunity to build new bridges: of working together between the public health communities in Europe and Africa and of seeking solutions to our shared challenges as inhabitants of a small planet now facing global threats, from climate change, emerging infections, and the global epidemic of non-communicable diseases. LEAVING NO ONE BEHIND

The 'health for all' principle, undersigned by all countries in the European region, identifies access to healthcare as a basic human right for everyone. Governments must be held accountable for providing healthcare to asylum seekers and undocumented migrants. More concretely, no one seeking asylum or without appropriate documentation should die or be put in danger by limited or no access to healthcare.

TRANSLATING KNOWLEDGE

On a policy level, the emergence of the anti-science movement and anti-immigration sentiment risk is undermining our health policies. Science is increasingly criticised and ignored by parts of society, and achievements made in health are negatively impacted. This undermining of science needs to be halted. At the same time, societies are exposed to anti-immigration sentiments. Both developments could lead to politically coloured health policies that increase health inequities for migrants. In translating health research and knowledge to policy and advocacy, we need to create a narrative that supports our vision for more health equity.

With the help of our partners, presenters, we offer you an exciting programme of workshops, oral and pitch presentations and poster walks. Our exhibitors are there to show you their latest projects, products and services. This is taking place in the multicultural setting of Marseille, giving you the possibility to share information, knowledge and innovative ideas with your colleagues from Europe and across the globe.



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PLENARY SPEAKERS



Natasha Azzopardi Muscat – President EUPHA

Natasha Azzopardi-Muscat is President of EUPHA since November 2016. She was previously President of the EUPHA section on Public Health Practice and Policy. She is a medical doctor by training and holds a PhD in public health and health services management. She is a founding member and former President of the Malta Association of Public Health Medicine. As a public health civil servant she occupied various senior positions in the Ministry of Health in Malta between 2001 and 2013. She is a former Chief Medical Officer for Malta. She currently works as a Consultant in Public Health Medicine at the Directorate for Health Information and Research and is a resident academic at the University of Malta. Her main research interests are European health policy and health systems in small states. She has authored several publications on these topics.



Ricardo Baptista Leite – Member of Parliament and Deputy Mayor and City Councillor of Cascais, Portugal

Member of the Portuguese Parliament, National Spokesperson for Health of the Social Democratic Party (PSD) and Head of Public Health at Católica University of Portugal. Founding President of 'UNITE – Global Parliamentarians Network to End HIV/AIDS, viral hepatitis and other infectious diseases'. Vice President of the 'Parliamentary Network on The World Bank & International Monetary Fund'. One of six people globally nominated by 'The Economist Intelligence Unit' (2016) as a 'HCV Change Maker' in recognition of leadership in the field of hepatitis c. Guest Lecturer at NOVA Information Management School and NOVA Medical School. Former Deputy Mayor and City Councilor of Cascais responsible for health, economic diplomacy and international relations.



Sophie Beau – European Civil Rescue Association SOS Méditerranée, France

Sophie Beau is co-founder of SOS Mediterranée, a Civil Sea Rescue Association, and General director for the French association. Holder of a master's degree in Anthropology and a postgraduate degree in Political Science (Paris I Sorbonne), she has directed social and humanitarian programs for twenty years. She has worked as a program manager for Médecins Sans Frontières and Médecins du Monde on numerous crisis areas in Africa, the Middle East and the Caucasus, as well as in the headquarters of these NGOs in France, in the Netherlands and in the USA. Since 2008, she has coordinated medico-social teams and accompanied the actors fighting against exclusion and solidarity. Co-founder of the association SOS Mediterranée in May 2015 with the German captain Klaus Vogel, she is executive director of the association in France and vice-president of the European network SOS Mediterranée.



Anne Bucher – Directorate-General for Health and Food Safety (DG SANTE), European Commission

In the European Commission since 1983, Anne Bucher is Director-General of DG SANTE since October 2018. Prior to that she was Director-General and Chair of the Regulatory Scrutiny Board as of March 2016. She also was Director for structural reforms and competitiveness in the Directorate General for economic and financial affairs from March 2011 until February 2016. Trained as an economist and statistician in Paris (PHD in macroeconomics – Ecole des Hautes Etudes), Anne Bucher has worked in various fields of European policies: macroeconomic forecast and models, structural funds, evaluation of employment policies, enlargement, development aid, information society strategy and economic analysis of EU tax policy. She has held various management positions, including administrative management positions for HR and budget management.

PLENARY SPEAKERS



Yves Charpak – Chair of the 12th European Public Health Conference

Yves Charpak graduated as medical doctor and specialized in public health. He has a PhD in biostatistics and was a researcher in clinical epidemiology during six years at INSERM, France. He then founded and headed a consultancy company dealing with evaluation in the health sector for more than ten years. In 2000, he joined WHO Regional Office for Europe as senior policy advisor to the Regional Director. From 2004 to 2007, he was WHO Euro's representative at the European Union. After his return to France he became Director of International Affairs of the Institut Pasteur for two years and then Director for Studies with the French Blood Transfusion System. He is vice-president of the Societe Francaise de Sante Publique (SFSP) and represents SFSP in the Governing Board of EUPHA and he is a diplomat of the World Federation of Public Health Associations (WFPHA) Global Charter.



Anna Cichowska Myrup – WHO Regional Office for Europe

Anna Cichowska Myrup is a medically trained public health specialist, with a special interest in public health leadership development. Anna is currently leading the WHO Regional Office Programme on Public Health Services, part of the Division of Health Systems and Public Health. The Programme supports WHO Member States, within the European Region, in their reforms of public health services, focusing on development of public health workforce, organization and financing for public health services, and public health legislation. She is the co-founder of the Coalition of Partners to Strengthen Public health Service in the European Region. Anna holds a medical degree from Maastricht University, Netherlands, and a Master's degree in public health from Edinburgh University, United Kingdom. She completed her public health specialization in the UK and is a fellow of the UK Faculty of Public Health.



Caroline Costongs – EuroHealthNet

Caroline Costongs is Director of EuroHealthNet, a European Partnership for improving health, equity and wellbeing, based in Brussels (www.eurohealthnet.eu). Caroline has an MSc in Public Health from the University of Maastricht (The Netherlands) and her main work focuses on policy, advocacy, research and capacity building in the field of health inequalities, health promotion across the life course, sustainable development and "Health in all Policies". She is a Board member of APHEA (Public Health Accreditation Agency) and member of the International Conference for the EPH Conference. Caroline has also worked at the Netherlands Olympic Committee and Sports Confederation (NOC*NSF) on physical activity promotion for young people. Before that, she was active at the Health Institute of the Liverpool John Moores University where she did research on healthy public policies in cities and at the National Capacity Building Institute (INICE) of the Honduras Ministry of Education.



Michael Edelstein – EUPHA Section Infectious diseases control

Michael Edelstein is a medical doctor specialized in infectious disease epidemiology. He is currently the president of the Infectious Diseases Control section of the European Public Health Association and leads on immunization data at Public Health England, England's national public health agency. He is also a member of the World Health Organization's working group on immunization data quality, a research fellow at the Centre on Global Health Security, Chatham House, an honorary associate professor at London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine. In recent years he has also responded to large scale public health emergencies in Asia and Africa, including the West African Ebola outbreak.



Karl Ekdahl – European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control (ECDC)

Karl Ekdahl is head of the Public Health Capacity and Communication Unit at the European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control (ECDC), where he is responsible for the Centre's activities related to preparedness, training, capacity building and communication. He has worked for more than twenty years with communicable disease prevention at regional, national and international levels. At ECDC, he was the first expert in place at the start-up of the Centre in 2005. Since then, he has held various senior positions including acting Director. He is a specialist in infectious diseases, and prior to joining ECDC, he was the Deputy State Epidemiologist for Sweden. In 2007, he was appointed Adjunct Professor in Infectious Disease Epidemiology at the Karolinska Institutet in Stockholm. He is also the former Editor-in-Chief of the high-impact scientific journal Eurosurveillance.



Josep Figueras – Director European Observatory on Health Systems and Policies

Josep Figueras is the Director of the European Observatory on Health Systems and Policies and head of the WHO European Centre on Health Policy in Brussels. In addition to WHO, he has served other major multilateral organisations such as the European Commission and the World Bank. He is a member of several advisory and editorial boards and has served as advisor in more than forty countries within the European region and beyond. He is honorary fellow of the UK Faculty of Public Health, has twice been awarded the EHMA prize, and in 2006 received the Andrija Stampar Medal. He was head of the MSc in health services management at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine and he is currently visiting professor at Imperial College, London. His research focuses on comparative health system and policy analysis.



Maryam Gardisi – Ipso, Germany

Maryam Gardisi is a cultural scientist and has worked for many years in the field of sociology, particularly in developing improvements for migrant integration within Germany's educational system. Currently she coordinates the Ipso Care Center in Berlin, Germany. Ipso - international psychosocial organization - is an internationally recognized organization active in mental health care, psychosocial support, and intra-cultural dialogue as a means for peace and reconciliation. Ipso has developed a psychosocial counselling approach which enables people to quickly regain their potential to become active agents of their own lives, caring and taking responsibility for themselves and their social environment. In Germany, Ipso has trained over 140 refugees from 17 different countries with a one-year programme which has enabled them to become professional psychosocial counsellors.



Scott L Greer – University of Michigan, United States

Scott L. Greer is Associate Professor of Health Management and Policy at the University of Michigan School of Public Health and Senior Expert Advisor on Health Governance for the European Observatory on Health Systems and Policies. He researches the politics of health policies, with a special focus on the politics and policies of the European Union and the impact of federalism on health care. Before coming to Michigan, he taught at University College London. He has published over fifty book chapters and articles in journals including the British Medical Journal, American Journal of Public Health, Social Science and Medicine, Journal of European Public Policy, Journal of European Social Policy, and Journal of Health Politics, Policy and Law.

PLENARY SPEAKERS



Sally Hargreaves – Imperial College London, United Kingdom

Sally Hargreaves is a Lecturer in Global Health at St George's, University London. She has an interest in migrant health and health systems research, with a particular focus on tuberculosis, latent tuberculosis, and vaccination. Current research studies focus on implementing innovative screening and catch-up vaccination tools for new migrants at primary and secondary health-care services, and intervention studies to improve treatment adherence in migrants with tuberculosis. She is Wellcome funded to explore the health needs of international labour migrants and has received funding from WHO to explore a minimum package of care for tuberculosis treatment in migrants across the WHO EURO Region. Collaborations include Public Health England, the UCL-Lancet Commission on Migrant Health, WHO, and ECDC.



Lucinda Hiam – London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine, United Kingdom

Lucinda Hiam is an NHS GP, and works for NGOs both at home and abroad. In the past year, she has worked for Médecins Sans Frontières in Uganda and in the Middle East, providing healthcare for Syrian refugees. She is part of the Primary Care International clinical team, working to strengthen family medicine worldwide. In the UK, she is a GP Champion for Doctors of the World, where she volunteers as a clinic doctor for those unable to access healthcare, such as undocumented migrants. She is passionate about advocating for access to healthcare, and for DOTW's 'stop sharing' campaign gave evidence to the UK Parliamentary health and social care select committee. Academically, She holds an honorary research fellow position at London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine, and is undertaking a part-time DPhil at the University of Oxford. Her research interests include overcoming barriers migrants face when accessing healthcare, and the impacts of austerity on health outcomes in the United Kingdom.



Bernadette Nirmal Kumar – Research member of the UCL– Lancet Commission on Migration and Health 2016–2018

Bernadette Nirmal Kumar is a medical graduate from St. Johns Medical College, India, and has a doctorate in Epidemiology and Public Health from the University of Oslo, Norway. She has extensive international experience working for UNICEF, WHO and World Bank in Southern Sudan, Somalia, Kenya, West Bank and Gaza, North Korea, China and Bhutan. Migration and health has been the focus of her research since 1999 and she is the co-editor and author of several text books on this topic. She was Director of the Norwegian Centre for Migration and Minority Health (NAKMI), and a commissioner of the Lancet Commission on Migration and Health (2018). Currently, she is Professor at the Empower School of Health, Haryana, India and is the President of the EUPHA Section Migration and ethnic minority health.



Charlotte Marchandise – Elected member of the City Council of Rennes, France

Charlotte Marchandise is Elected member of the City Council of Rennes, France, and delegate for health and environment since March 2014. She was elected as an independent candidate without the backing of a political party. Previously, she worked as consultant/trainer in the field of public health, social work, education and environment. She was elected in September 2014 to the presidency of the French Network of Healthy Cities of WHO. Through this network, action was launched for municipal health policies, fighting against social inequalities in health and making the voice of local actors heard at national level. Her leading principle is working together on common projects by all political parties. In 2016, she was elected president of LaPrimaire.org, the primary citizen movement on the internet.



Isabel de la Mata – Directorate-General for Health and Food Safety (DG SANTE), European Commission

Isabel de la Mata worked as Counsellor for Health and Consumers at the Permanent Representation of Spain to the EU, as Deputy Director General for Health Planning at the Spanish Ministry of Health, as Adviser to the Vice-minister of Health and several other posts at the Ministry of Health of Spain and the Regional Departments in the Basque Country and in Madrid. In addition, she has been a member of the EURO-WHO Standing Committee of the Regional Committee, and has worked with the Pan American Health Organisation, the Inter-American Development Bank and the Spanish Agency for International Cooperation. Dr de la Mata graduated in Medicine and Surgery by the University of Basque Country in 1983 and holds post-graduate degrees from the University of Leuven and Paris VI in Public Health, Hospital Administration and Statistics. She is a specialist in Preventive Medicine and Public Health.



Sara McQuinn – EUPHAnxt

Sara McQuinn is the Coordinator of EUPHAnxt – the next generation network in EUPHA (European Public Health Association). EUPHAnxt is a unique network within EUPHA for students and young professionals in the field of public health. It was established in 2011, and is coordinated by students and young professionals. Sara is a PhD SPHeRE Scholar, based in Dublin City University, Ireland. Her research explores physical activity levels and behaviour change interventions. Before starting her PhD, Sara completed a MSc by Research on European child and young people's health, as part of the European Commission's BRIDGE Health Project. Sara graduated with a BSc in Public Health from University College Cork, Ireland, in 2015. In 2014, Sara completed an internship at the World Health Organisation, Regional Office for Europe.



John Middleton – President ASPHER

John Middleton is President of the Association of Schools of Public Health in the European Region (ASPHER). He is Honorary Professor of Public Health at Wolverhampton University and Visiting Professor of Public Health at Chester University, United Kingdom. He was President of the United Kingdom Faculty of Public Health, the standard setting body for public health professionals in the UK until June 2019. He was Director of Public Health (DPH) for Sandwell in the West Midlands of England for 27 years; until he retired in 2014, he was the longest serving DPH in England. He was awarded Fellowship of the Royal College of Physicians in September 2015. He lives in Coventry in the West Midlands. He has interests in environmental health, sustainable development and violence prevention.



Jean-Paul Moatti – Institut de Recherche pour le Développement (IRD), France

Jean-Paul Moatti is the CEO of the French National Research Institute for Sustainable Development (IRD) since 2015. In 2016, the UN Secretary General appointed him to the group of international experts in charge of writing the UN's 2019 Global Sustainable Development Report (GSDR). Since 2018, he is also the president of the "AllEnvi" Alliance in charge of coordinating all the French environmental sciences. During his career, he has carried out numerous scientific functions in public health and health economics particularly contributing to the fight against HIV/Aids and malaria, access to essential medicines, improving health systems and reducing social and inequalities.

PLENARY SPEAKERS



Otto Scharmer – MIT Management Sloan School, Cambridge, United States

Otto Scharmer, Senior Lecturer at MIT Management Sloan School and the founder of Presencing Institute, introduced the concept of “presencing”—learning from the emerging future—in his books Theory U and Presence. He co-founded the MITx u.lab, a massive open online course for leading profound change, which has since activated a global eco-system of societal and personal renewal involving more than 140,000 users from 185 countries. In 2019, he co-founded the Societal Transformation Lab helping place-based teams to reinvent education, governance, and our economies worldwide. He received the Jamieson Prize for Teaching Excellence at MIT and the European Leonardo Corporate Learning Award. The United Nations Deputy Secretary-General appointed him to the UN Learning Advisory Council for the 2030 Agenda.



Santino Severoni – WHO Regional Office for Europe

Santino Severoni is Director a.i. Division of Health System and Public Health and Special Advisor, Migrants and Health at the WHO Regional Office for Europe. He has over 24 years’ experience as an international technical advisor and executive, working for governments, multilateral organizations, nongovernmental organizations and foundations in eastern Africa, central Asia, the Balkans and Europe. His professional work has been dedicated to global health, focusing on health sector reform, health system strengthening, health diplomacy, aid coordination/effectiveness and management of complex emergencies. He worked to establish the WHO Global Migration programme, established the Knowledge Hub on Health and Migration and coordinated the first report on the health of refugees and migrants in the WHO European Region.



Miklós Szócska – Semmelweis University, Budapest, Hungary

Miklós Szócska graduated at the Semmelweis University (SU) of Medicine in 1989. He holds a Master of Public Administration degree from the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University and a PhD from the SU in the field of change management. After his graduation he and colleagues initiated the creation of the Health Services Management Training Centre (HSMTC). Between 1995 and 2000 he was serving as the deputy director and in 2000 he was appointed director of the Centre. Between 2010-2014 Miklós Szócska served as the Minister of State for Health of the Hungarian Government. Since 2014 he serves again as the Director of HSMTC and became responsible for the Institute of Digital Health Sciences at SU. In July 2019 Miklós Szócska was appointed to be the Dean of the Faculty of Health and Public Services at Semmelweis University.



Paula Vassallo – President European Dental Public Health Association (EADPH)

Paula Vassallo is a Consultant in Dental Public Health and has recently been elected President of the European Association of Dental Public Health. She is a senior lecturer in Preventive and Community Dentistry and Dental Public Health at the University of Malta. She is a board member of the Council of European Chief Dental Officers and of the Platform for Better oral Health in Europe. She is also member of the health research group of the Institute of Small Island States. She is Past President of the Council of European Chief Dental Officers and is immediate past Chairperson of the Platform for Better Oral health in Europe. She has also chaired the Working Group of Oral Health in The CED (Council of European Dentists) and was responsible for guiding the development of CED policies related to oral health issues. She is currently the Director of Health Promotion and Disease Prevention within the Ministry of Health in Malta.



Liisa-Maria Voipio-Pulkki – Ministry of Social Affairs and Health, Finland

Liisa-Maria Voipio-Pulkki is currently serving as the Director General of Strategic Affairs and Chief Medical Officer of the Finnish Ministry of Social Affairs and Health. Previously she was employed as the Senior Medical Adviser of the Finnish Association of Local and Regional Authorities in 2004–2009, Chief of Emergency and Acute Care of the Helsinki University Hospital District in 2000–2004 and as a specialist and Adjunct Professor of Medicine in the University Hospital of Turku, Finland. She has chaired several national working groups on health system reforms, continuous professional development and research and innovation policies. Since 2017 she has chaired the Steering Committee of the European Observatory on Health Systems and Policies. Most recently, she has been actively involved in the preparations for the Finnish EU Council Presidency during the second half of 2019.



Dineke Zeegers Paget – Executive Director EUPHA

Dineke Zeegers Paget is the Executive Director of EUPHA - the European Public Health Association – a network of national public health associations aimed at voicing knowledge and capacity building. Dineke has a law degree, followed by a PhD on comparing AIDS legislation in the world (1996). Before starting to work at EUPHA in 1997, she worked at the World Health Organization HQ and the University of Groningen where she worked on legal issues and human rights related to AIDS. Between 1992 and 1997, she worked at the Swiss Federal Ministry of Public Health, as a coordinator of AIDS projects in specific target groups and health promotion in prisons.

Each year WHO outlines that epidemics and outbreaks of influenza trigger up to half a million deaths worldwide. In Europe, almost 30% of the burden of communicable diseases in Europe is due to influenza and an average of 40,000 people die due to influenza. It has been demonstrated that a large part of this burden could be avoided by higher influenza VCR reaching the WHO/EU 75% target. Current influenza VCR in EU range from 2% (Estonia) to 73% (UK) and countries face difficulties in reversing the trend post-2009 pandemic year. While vaccines policies remain a national competence, the EU has been steering with the adoption of the EU Council Recommendation in December 2018 to strengthen the EU cooperation on vaccine-preventable diseases. This initiative, amongst other demonstrates the timely opportunity to strengthen the teaming-up approach to implement national vaccination plans with initiatives to improve coverages and thereby population health outcome.





FLOOR PLAN

GLOBAL VIEW



