The theme of the virtual WCPH 2020 remains *Public Health for the Future of Humanity: Analysis, Advocacy, and Action*, reflecting our firm commitment that we, in the global public health community, have an obligation to respond to the current coronacrisis and other emerging global challenges.

In a series of eight plenary sessions we will further explore these current challenges. We look at what happened to our principles of the Enlightenment: evidence and reason.
