Budget Hotel List – World Congress on Public Health, 12 – 17 October 2020, Rome, Italy

It is possible to come to attend the World Congress and stay in Rome on the budget. Rome has many opportunities to host you on the budget, starting from private houses, bed and breakfast, hostel and camp sites. Note that the religious accommodation may be a good alternative for you.

The center of Rome, from Piazza del Popolo to San Giovanni, is a very expensive area, to have a cheaper stay it is better to look distant from the Centre. We suggest to find your stay along the Blu line subway, as it may be easier to arrive to the Congress Venue. Don't expect the suburb of EUR to offer a lot of cheap accommodation. EUR is an upmarket residential area and also a business and governmental centre, so many accommodations there are either upscale or more costly than you might expect.
