



The evidence-based and peer-reviewed policy has been embraced by all 53 Member States in the WHO European Region and is vital as Europe is faced with many different challenges that impact our health and demand different ways of thinking and behaving.

The M&E framework details the way that good health contributes across society and provides policymakers a vision, a strategic path, a set of priorities and a range of suggestions about what works to

improve health and address health inequalities. This will ensure the health of future generations for everyone in the European Region.





- Peer reviewed.



- An official WHO source for evidence listed in PubMed.






WHO's response in facilitating research use

EVIPNet Europe: mandate



- Promotes in support of Health 2020 and the EHII – the systematic use of research evidence in policy-making to improve health systems through a networked structure;
- Increases country capacity in developing sound and effective health policies;
- Institutionalizes knowledge translation through the establishment of national advisory bodies ensuring that policies are grounded in research evidence.







Resolution goal: single integrated health information system for Europe





Regional Committee for Europe

Copenhagen, Denmark,12-15 September 2016

Provisional agenda item 5(j)

- Strengthening health information systems, harmonizing health indicators and establishing an integrated health information system for the European Region;
- 2. Establishing and promoting health research systems to support the setting of public health priorities;
- 3. Increasing country capacities for the development of evidence-informed policies (knowledge translation);
- 4. Mainstreaming the use of evidence, information and research in the implementation of Health 2020 and other major regional policy frameworks.

Health information strategies

Support tool to enhance national health information systems and develop national health information strategies



- Member States requested practical support tool
- Tool developed by Working Group (17 countries), co-chaired by Netherlands and Russian Federation
- Based on WHO HMN tools and materials, adapted to European context
- Available in English & Russian
- Piloted in three countries and revision under-way.



National eHealth Strategy Toolkit



- A resource for developing or renewing a country's eHealth strategy
- From countries just setting out to those that have already invested in eHealth
- A framework and method for the development of a vision, action plan and monitoring framework
