She described the need of research in the context of the effects of the pandemic on mental health. Chiara Samele and Julian Beezholt took over to share insights on GAMIAN-Europe's brand new survey about mental health needs & services during the pandemic, from both a patient and clinicians perspective. Radka Maxová, co-chair of the MEP Alliance for Mental Health mentioned the growing demand on mental health services due to the pandemic and the war in Ukraine and the many challenges that are ahead of us in the mental health. She's working on a comprehensive EU strategy as an answer to the mental health situation. Helen Bennett there after told about her successfull practice, followed by John Saunders' vision on the current state of mind on mental health services, seen from the carer perspective. To top the session off, a panel of experts by experience (Erik van der Eycken, Paivi Rissanen and Péter Kéri) shared their country perspectives.

Other events today


Of course there were a lot more events today. Let us give you a little glimpse:
