

Minutes Join the network meeting 10 November 2021

EUPHA section on Health Services Research (EUPHA-HSR)

Welcome

Johan Hansen and Lorena Dini Pou Del Castillo, President and vice-President of the Section, welcomed participants to this online Join the Network (JTN) Meeting. This was followed by a brief personal introduction of all attendees. In total 19 people attended the JTN meeting. The protocol notes were made by our Section volunteer Master-Student, who participated as invited observer.

Survey among HSR Section Members

The first agenda point covered the presentation of the preliminary survey results of the online questionnaire circulated among Section Members in the month prior to the EPH conference. The purpose of the survey was to obtain a better understanding about the composition of the Section HSR and about the views and preferences of Section Members, this to be able to tailor activities according to their needs.

The survey among others collected inputs on the types of topics Member thought the Section should focus on, both at national and at European level. This led to a range of topics, which can also feed into preparations for workshops at next annual conferences. In addition, Members could indicate whether they would be interested in joining training sessions, and if so, on which topics. Especially training sessions on applied research methodologies and international proposal writing were mentioned most often. Other topics also included how to conduct comparative health systems research and how to use science communication and visualization for informing policy making.

During the JTN meeting this list of topics was complemented and reaffirmed by a number of suggestions by participants as listed below

- methodology in general
- methods to use existing demographic and health data to evaluate health interventions
- complex intervention evaluation in HSR
- applied research methodologies
- evaluation in its whole spectrum
- searching evidence of effective improvement
- comparative HSR in general



- comparative HSR from an inequity perspective (ex access)
- data visualisation for effective research communication
- staying updated with software-development e.g. in relation to conducting systematic reviews
- international proposal writing
- creating online-surveys

It was concluded that there is particularly a strong <u>methodological focus</u> on training sessions as well as on <u>comparative approaches</u> between countries. In 2022 a first training session will be organised on one of the priority topics listed.

Networking among HSR Members

In 2021 the Section has created a LinkedIn group, titled "European Network of Health Services Research" (see https://www.linkedin.com/groups/9089335/)

The group is open to all interested parties, including those who are not based in Europe and/or are not members of EUPHA.

Members were also invited to share their own news items via the same LinkedIn Group, making it a bottom-up and interactive instrument for networking and information sharing.

Strengthening collaboration with National HSR Networks

As European network in the area of HSR, it was considered important to also connect more actively to national HSR networks, or else support their establishment if not yet present at national level.

The case was presented of collaboration with the German Network of HSR, (DNVF) which has recently also established its Working Group in International Health Services Research (WG IHSR). Aim of that Working Group is to foster networking, finding synergies and promoting collaboration amongst healthcare researchers internationally with their German counterparts. Section Members were invited to become a member and submit presentations in an English track at the 2022 conference.

It was also discussed to establish similar synergies with other existing national HSR networks, where possible. This idea was well received. Members were invited to actively engage and communicate about their willingness to act as a linkage or anchor for this purpose.

Upcoming HSR Initiatives worth highlighting

Highlighted initiative at the Section meeting was the European Partnership on Health and Care Systems Transformation under Horizon Europe. Its aim is among others to create funding opportunities for national applicants from member countries in the Partnership. Focus will be on how to transform health and care systems and improve the uptake and transfer of service and policy innovations across Europe. More information at

- The idea was also brought up to look at and discuss cultural differences in doing HSR in different countries. Since the link between HSR and clinical departments is much stronger in some countries it could be interesting to look at the advantages and disadvantages.
- Also discussion took place on the pros and cons of online meetings, which are difficult to use
 as networking opportunities but at the same time are more open events since more people
 can participate in them.


