Background. Many countries are facing challenges with the skill mix of the health workforce. Optimizing the skill-mix is a key strategy to strengthen the health workforce and improving health system performance. But identifying really innovative skill-mix models and implementing them is rather challenging. Any effective response to this challenge will need to rest on robust comparative research to identify and assess the 'what' and 'how' of skill-mix innovations. To this end it is of utmost importance to provide a platform for the health workforce research community to develop a common understanding of the health workforce challenges patients, practitioners, policy makers, health systems and researchers are facing.
