The consultation is available to anyone who wants to share their opinion, whether you are a researcher, policymaker, health care professional or citizen. As the consultation is in all EU Member States, the survey is in English. If this is a complication, then the research group will do its best to also incorporate answers in other languages. All responses remain anonymous and will be used by the European Commission funded project TO-REACH. It consists of national funding bodies across Europe and aims to identify potential topics for joint calls of research in a future joint research programme. Results will also be shared with officers of the European Commission to support their preparations for their new research programme, titled Horizon Europe, to run from 2021-2027 as follow-up of Horizon 2020. A high response from experts and stakeholders per country can help make a strong voice on the contents of such a programme, that is aimed to help solve major health system and policy challenges. Expert Meeting on Professionalization of the Public Health Workforce

WHO Europe, ASPHER and Imperial College London organised an 'Expert Meeting on Professionalization of the Public Health Workforce', London, UK, 19 June 2018; for details see: http://www.euro.who.int/en/media-centre/events/events/2018/06/expert-meeting-on-

Three major actions were discussed in London: (1) Core Competencies Framework for Public Health Workforce in the European Region, (2) Handbook for Managing Public Health Professional Credentialing and Accreditation Systems in the European Region, and (3) Roadmap towards Professionalization of the Public Health Workforce in the European Region. The discussion is connected to the Coalition of Partners (CoP) project, led by WHO Europe; http://www.euro.who.int/en/healthtopics/Health-systems/public-health-services/coalition-of-partners. It will be continued during the 3rd CoP meeting, held in Ljubljana prior to the EUPHA Conference. EUPHA HWR section participated in the London meeting and is closely collaborating with ASPHER to improve knowledge and research related to the public health workforce; see the joint ASPHER/ HWR section Workshop in Ljubljana.
