Aims and objectives of the course

Research in Public Mental Health course aims to develop knowledge and skills on:

- main concepts, principles and issues of public mental health,
- concepts and methods in mental health epidemiology,
- assessment methods in public mental health,
- construction and piloting of life events and mental health questionnaires.

Learning outcomes

Students will develop their knowledge and understanding of public mental health, epidemiologic and other methodological approaches from life course perspective. The course will enable students to identify, understand and evaluate public mental health issues, understand and apply core research methods in mental health epidemiology, data assessment, construction and piloting of questionnaires on life events and mental health. Students will be able to apply this knowledge and understanding in practice. The course also aims to improve general competences of abstract, analytical systemic, critical thinking, ability to work independently and in team.

Contact sessions

Contact sessions of the course include lectures and workshops. Course methods entail a mix of multimedia presentations, case discussions, and practical tasks.

Duration of the course is 25 academic hours, 10 hours whereof are lectures and 15 hours – workshops.

References: compulsory and recommended readings will be handed during the course.

Course assessment

At the end of the course a standard course evaluation questionnaire will be circulated.

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
