

Annual report 2020 EUPHA section on Sexual and Gender Minority Health (EUPHA-SGMH)

This report shortly summarizes the section's previous and current aims and activities, and the planned activities for 2021.

Previous activities by the section, 2016-2019

The EUPHA section on Sexual and Gender Minority Health was formally established in November 2016 after decisions by the EUPHA Section Council and the EUPHA Governing Board. In 2016, the section worked on further developing and clarifying the section's aim and vision. From 2017 to 2019, the section focused on establishing the necessary logistical and communication channels and expanding the network of affiliated researchers and students.

Activities in 2020

Among other activities, the section has focused on:

• Expanding the network:

The network membership grew by 54.1% over the past 12 months (473 members in September 2019 and 729 in September 2020).

• Collaborating with other EUPHA sections

After appointing several informal liaison persons with several other EUPHA sections in 2018, different collaborations have been realized, including a joint workshop proposal with EUPHA-PMH at the World Congress on Public Health.

• Increasing visibility and awareness at the annual conference and beyond

Seminar during the European Public Health Week

During the European Public Health Week, Dr. Richard Bränström (Karolinska Institute, Sweden, and section president) presented current research concerning the mental health of young lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender individuals. The seminar was organized by EUPHA section on Urban Public Health and the University of Manchester. Besides these activities, the section organized three different workshops during the virtual World Congress on Public Health, titled: 'Sexual minorities' mental health and their experiences of stigma and minority stress across settings' in collaboration with EUPHA-PMH, 'Ecosystems of HIV risk among key populations in Europe: empirical findings and solutions' and 'Institutional barriers and support influencing the health and well-being of LGBT individuals.' Furthermore, the section was represented in several other sessions, e.g., panel



discussions and poster presentations. The section also organized a section meeting or socalled Join-The-Network meeting.

Activities in 2021

The section is planning on the following activities in 2021:

- Section pamphlet: A document outlining the section's aim in several languages is being drafted and will be published and shared with the network.
- *Country representatives*: The section is planning to pursue the idea to appoint country representatives to facilitate networking and collaboration within and between countries. A call for country representatives will be circulated during fall 2020/early 2021.
- *EPH Dublin*: Several topics were suggested for the upcoming EPH conference in Dublin next year, such as "LGBTQ populations and the COVID pandemic" and "LGBT health and increasingly hostile political climates" (possibly in collaboration with EUPHA PHPP and ILGA.
- *Digital forum*: The section is looking for a solution that would provide a more forum-based environment where members can share thoughts, ideas, and requests. Options as Twitter, Facebook Groups, and LinkedIn were discussed. Other suggestions are welcomed.
- Section election: EUPHA requires periodical elections for the section leadership. An election may be organized in 2021 or at a later date. Members will be able to nominate themselves or others for the positions of president and/or vice president.
