

EUPHA Communications Intern - CUE-CAN Project

The European Public Health Association (EUPHA) is looking for a

Communications Intern

to support its work in the EU-funded **CUE-CAN project**.

CUE-CAN explores how environmental exposures may contribute to childhood, adolescent and young adult cancers. **CUE-CAN aims to generate evidence that can support better prevention, early detection and policy action on environmental cancer risks affecting children and young people.** Within the project, EUPHA leads the work on **dissemination, stakeholder engagement and communication**, helping to make the project's results visible, accessible and useful for scientific, policy, clinical, public health and public audiences.

The internship will focus especially on the first eight months of the project, during which EUPHA will support the launch of the project website and social media channels, prepare the Communication and Dissemination Plan, coordinate input from project partners, and support reporting on the first project deliverables and milestones.

Main tasks

Website and social media launch until December 2026

The intern will help prepare website content for the CUE-CAN project, coordinate inputs from project partners, and liaise with the external website provider. The intern will also contribute to the launch of the project's social media channels and draft and schedule basic social media content.

Communication and Dissemination Plan until December 2026

The intern will support the preparation of the project's Communication and Dissemination Plan. This includes collecting information from project partners on target audiences, communication channels, stakeholder networks and planned dissemination activities, reviewing and organising partner contributions into a clear overview for planning and reporting.

Stakeholder mapping and engagement

The intern will contribute to the consortium-wide stakeholder mapping exercise. This includes reviewing and consolidating partner input, identifying relevant stakeholder categories, and preparing stakeholder engagement materials.

Relevant audiences may include scientific, policy, regulatory, clinical, public health and public stakeholder groups.

EU reporting and project documentation

The intern will engage in the preparation of evidence for the first CUE-CAN deliverables and milestone reporting. This includes helping to document the launch of the website and social media channels, support in setting up communication KPIs and analytics and collecting partner inputs, files, and documentation.

Profile

We are looking for a motivated intern who:

- Has an interest in public health, science communication, EU-funded projects, stakeholder engagement or health policy.
- Has strong written and spoken English.
- Has good attention to detail.
- Is comfortable managing several tasks at the same time.
- Has good writing and organisational skills.
- Is able to work independently and communicate clearly in an international team.
- Has some experience with social media, website content, newsletters, visual communication or project coordination, which would be an asset.
- Is a student or recent graduate in public health, communication, health sciences, European studies, political science or a related field.
- Is based in Europe and able to work remotely with EUPHA and project partners.

- **Start date:** Mid-August 2026, or as soon as possible thereafter.
- **Duration:** 6 months.
- **Working time:** 18–20 hours per week.
- **Location:** Remote, with coordination through the EUPHA office in the Netherlands.
- **Eligibility:** Applicants should be based in Europe and should be students or recent graduates.
- **Allowance:** €400 monthly internship allowance, subject to applicable tax and social security treatment.
