The European Public Health Association (EUPHA) is looking for an

EHUP Programme Intern

to support the implementation of the **European Health Union Priority Programme (EHUP)** at the European Public Health Conference (EPH) 2026.

The EHUP Programme is funded through the EU4Health Programme and aims to strengthen dialogue between science, policy and practice by bringing together researchers, policymakers, public health professionals, civil society organisations and European institutions. Through high-level sessions, policy dialogues, stakeholder engagement and dissemination activities, the programme contributes to the implementation of the European Health Union priorities.

The internship will focus on supporting the preparation, delivery and follow-up of the EHUP Programme in the months leading up to the European Public Health Conference in Bilbao (10–13 November 2026), while also contributing to reporting and dissemination activities after the conference.

Main tasks

Scientific and policy programme support

The intern will contribute to stakeholder engagement activities across the EHUP Programme. This includes coordinating information from EUPHA Sections, EUPHANxt, national public health associations and other partners, preparing meeting documentation, monitoring invitations and registrations, and supporting collaboration with European Commission services and other stakeholders where appropriate.

Conference preparation and onsite delivery

The intern will support the operational preparation of the EHUP Programme before the conference and assist during the event in Bilbao. Tasks include preparing session documentation, supporting speakers and moderators, coordinating practical information, assisting with the exhibition area and helping collect evaluation data and attendance information during EHUP sessions.

EU reporting and project documentation

The intern will assist with collecting documentation required for EU4Health reporting. This includes maintaining records of activities, gathering supporting evidence for deliverables, organising project documentation, assisting with evaluation reports and contributing to the preparation of policy summaries and other project outputs following the conference.

Profile

We are looking for a motivated intern who:

- Has an interest in public health, European health policy, EU-funded projects or scientific conferences.
- Has strong written and spoken English.
- Has excellent organisational skills and attention to detail.
- Is comfortable managing multiple tasks simultaneously.
- Enjoys working with a wide range of international stakeholders.
- Is able to work independently while contributing effectively within a small international team.
- Has an interest in project coordination, stakeholder engagement or event management; previous experience in these areas is an asset.
- Is a student or recent graduate in public health, European studies, health sciences, political science, international relations or a related field.
- Is based in Europe and able to work remotely with EUPHA and its project partners.
- Has good attention to detail.
- Is comfortable managing several tasks at the same time.
- Has good writing and organisational skills.
- Is able to work independently and communicate clearly in an international team.

- **Duration:** 6 months.
- **Working time:** 18–20 hours per week.
- **Location:** Remote, with coordination through the EUPHA office in the Netherlands.
- **Eligibility:** Applicants should be based in Europe and should be students or recent graduates.
- **Allowance:** €400 monthly internship allowance, subject to applicable tax and social security treatment.
